#### **CLASS HISTORY**

In the month of September 1943 the school bell in the tower rang and many children trotted off to school for the first time. Those beginning in 1943 were to graduate in 1955 if all went well. Twelve long years have passed so, let us take a look back and see what has happened.

Two teachers, Mrs. Guy and Miss Britton helped us in our first year. It took several days to get acquainted and here was started many friendships which have lasted through the years. We were excited and eager as we were given our books because we knew we

would learn many new and wonderful things.

By the second year the class felt they had been in school for years. Our teachers, Mrs. Kemper and Miss Messick weren't really new to us, for we had seen them the year before and knew them to be second grade teachers. New faces appeared in the class as we continued our lessons from last year and by Christmas we were learning to write.

SPOT CAFE Mechanicsburg Third grade was our really big year in elementary school. One third grade was upstairs where the fourth, fifth, and sixth grades were and the kids thought they were very grown up. Mrs. Bracher had the class upstairs and Mrs. Ingram had the class downstairs. Multiplication tables were our problem and it certainly took some of us a long time to learn them.

We finally got upstairs, where the "big wheels" were, in the fourth grade. Mrs. Caplinger and Mrs. Egbert were our teachers. One of our boys was good looking and the sixth grade girls would come over and borrow books so they could talk to him.

The rush really started in the fifth grade. This year we began to feel older and tried to act older, much to the dismay and disgust of our teachers. Each class was taught by a different teacher and Mrs. Thompson and Mrs. Roseberry were our homeroom teachers.

The next year was the one we were looking forward to. We were in the sixth grade and the oldest students in the building. Our teachers this year were Mr. Foulk and Miss Longbrake, who had taught some of our mothers and fathers. We elected class officers for both homerooms and the boys in our classes got to be top officers on the school boys patrol. This year was the beginning of the making of our best and future high school football players as they made the junior high football squad. We were so bad acting by November that we were told that we wouldn't have any recesses for the whole month. We found out that Mr. Foulk was going back into the army and we felt terrible because he would remember us as being naughty. We decided to do something nice for him so we had a surprise pot luck dinner and gave him a billfold. Mrs. Roseberry came back as Mr. Foulk's replacement and finished out the school term.

By the time we reached the seventh grade our class had grown to one hundred and two students and all of us thought we were "king pins". However in the spring of that year we were, by experience, a little older and a little wiser. Mr. Pickard and Miss Slocum were our teachers in our seventh year. At the end of the first semester Mr.

Pittenger took Miss Slocum's place when she resigned.

Next year in the eighth grade, Mr. Bigg and Mr. Weber were our teachers. Instead of getting better, this year, we got worse. First someone broke a window glass and then a seat which we had to pay for. We had a magazine subscription sale and made enough money to make the first payment on the intercommunication system we now have in our school rooms.

Finally we were freshmen in high school. For the first time our class was divided into three sections as we had grown to a total of ninety students. Our teachers were Mr. Sweet, Mr. Kirkland and Mr. Diley. We were the first to use the new wing that had just been built for the high school building. We were able to join many of the fine clubs in the high school and were glad of this opportunity.

Our sophomore year was about the same. This year we had the whole middle floor of the new wing to ourselves. Our teachers were Mr. McVay, Mr. Diley, and the soft

spoken teacher with the southern accent, Mrs. Dyer.

As juniors there was much to do. After the first couple of weeks of school we chose our class rings. Soon it came time to start our play. The name of the play was "The Nit Wits." Next we sponsored a class supper and made a little money to put in our class treasury. Then we started to plan our big project of the year, the Junior-Senior Prom. Since we had done everything else different while we had been in school, we decided to make the prom the biggest and best ever. First of all we decided to decorate the gym using the theme of "The Stork Club." We went one step further and held the first all night prom ever held in the Mechanicsburg Schools. Some people said that it would be a flop but as usual we proved them wrong and it was a huge success. Many of the school board and faculty said that it was the most beautifully decorated gymnasium that they had ever seen for a prom and I guess we had a right to stick our chests out just a bit further. It is said that some people had to get larger hats as their heads were slightly swollen after all the wonderful comment.

During our senior year we were busier than ever. We had our senior pictures taken, chose our name cards and invitations, were measured out for caps and gowns, and undertook the class project of sponsoring the school yearbook for 1955. As you can tell by this book it, too, is a success. Our senior play "Sing For Your Supper", was presented in April before a capacity audience on both nights under the direction of Mr. Clyde McDaniels. Most of us were seriously thinking about what we were going to do after graduation but generally we were undecided. Regardless as to what ever we do or become we can say that we really made history as we were the largest class to ever



The 1955 edition of the Mechanicsburg Indians made an excellent showing, under a new head coach, by outscoring West Jefferson to the tune of 41-27 in the opening game for both squads. A good size crowd was on hand as the "touchdown twins" of Tom Nott and Corky Welch assisted by fullback Jim Bailey scored all the Indians points. Welch led the scoring with 23 points.

For the second game of the season the team went to Mt. Sterling and really exploded with 33 points in the first quarter while going on to win by a score of 58 to 18. Highlights of the game were Corky Welch's punt returns of 65 and 70 yards for scores and Tom Nott's 60 yard run on a reverse play to score. The reserves played the bigger share of this game and added their names to the scoring list for the season. Rodger Tobias passed 45 yards to Nigle Standley for a "TD" and Jim Bailey bolted up the middle for scores on runs of 60 and 71 yards.

Tom Nott contributed three touchdowns and an extra point as the Indians continued their winning ways with a 25-6 victory over Southeastern in their first official Clark County League game. Ron Love made the final score by running 60 yards with an intercepted pass.

Ron Welch caught four passes, one for a touchdown, and played great defensive ball at his end position, as the Indians defeated Tecumseh 21-0. The Indians not only continued to improve their offensive power but also showed defensive power as they held Tecumseh to only one first down, and that on the last play of the game.

Northeastern of the Clark County league became Mechanicsburg fourth victim by a score of 19-6 in a hard fought game. Tom Nott again led the attack but was outshone by his brother, Dick Nott, even though he failed to score, by racing 80 yards on a keep play. Guard Lloyd Goheen playing his first and only game at fullback, ploughed across for the next Indian touchdown. Ray Logan got into the scoring column with an extra point plunge which was good. The Indians scored their sixth victory of the campaign and fourth in Clark County league competition. The victory over Northwestern, by a score of 39-12, also assured the Indians of at least a tie for the loop honors. Ron Welch caught two passes for "TD's" and Corky Welch scored once while Tom Nott wrapped up the league scoring record with three more touchdowns. The issue was settled early as we scored four times in the first half.

Corky Welch led the touchdown brigade against Enon with two touchdowns as Ray Logan, Paul Castle, and Tom Nott scored in walloping the Tigers, 33-7. The Indians finished the season undefeated in league play and were awarded the championship trophy.

The undefeated Mechanicsburg squad journeyed to Hilliards for their next game and experienced a close call in a hard fought game by a score of 7-6. Hilliard was primed for an upset and stopped the Indian's high powered offensive with the exception of a 60 yard drive after the opening kickoff, climaxed by a bolt up the middle for the final 18 yards by Corky Welch. Welch calmly kicked what proved to be the winning margin. Hilliard followed with a 58 yard touchdown drive but the extra point failed as end Paul Castle broke through, and with a great effort, blocked the kick to preserve his team's spotless record.

The most successful 1954 season ended with a jolt as the Urbana Hillclimbers smashed the Indians eight game victory string with a 14 to 6 decision. The team showed plenty of power and drive as is usually the case against Urbana but were hurt on offense because of Corky Welch being forced out of the game and an injury to Tom Nott which had not healed from the Hilliard game.

The season was a success and a great deal of credit must go to every member of the squad who helped to drive the first team on to greater efforts in compiling a very fine record.

Reserve games were played during the season, on Monday nights, against the reserve squads of the teams whom we had met on the previous Friday Night. The reserves were victors in all their games but one, that being a loss to West Jefferson.

All the graduating seniors will be greatly missed but it is hoped that some of the very promising underclassmen will take over and help Mechanicsburg High School to have another fine football squad and successful season in 1955.






