Class History

And it came to pass, as it is with all 6-year olds, that on September 10, 1945 a group of well-scrubbed delegates representing 35 different families stormed the halls of the "School on the Hill". Under the leadership of Miss Britton, Mrs. Guy, and Mrs. Messick our class began its career which was to lead to a great prosperity in the future. Here we were initiated into a different routine from any we had known before. Here there was a host of learning and many different things to do.

1946 brought new leaders such as Mrs. Francis and Mrs. Kemper. That year our group became more learned. That year Dusty Ackerman couldn't make up his mind whether he liked us or not. He started the first semester, went back to Rosedale the second semester, then decided he couldn't stay away and came back We were also joined by Jim Hixon, Charles Mason, and last but not least-Phyllis Wyatt, from Wheelersburg, who could forsee what a great class we would be.

1947 found us studying new subjects of geography and history under Lucy Moore and Agnes Bowen. We were to leave this year with a broader knowledge of our world which up until this time consisted only of our families and friends.

Urbana was far away, we thought.

1948 found us under the leadership of Mrs. Cligrow and Mrs. Caplinger. That year Sue Hayes, attracted by our charm, decided to leave Cable to join us. Barbara James heard of us way up in Toledo and came immediately to verify what she had heard. Well, anyway she stayed. Jasper Propst found his way to our class that year, also.

1949, our fifth year, offered us something different. We not only had a home room teacher but other teachers came to see us. They were Glenna Thompson,

John Roseberry, and Mr. Weber.

In 1950 we found ourselves in the 6th grade and did we feel superior because we were the oldest goup in that building. However, our teachers --- Mrs. Roseberry, Mr. Roseberry and Miss Littler-believed otherwise, and let us know

it. Miriam Shonkwiler decided to honor us by her presence.

1951 brought an almost complete change. Miss Reiger and Miss Wolf guided us through our 7th year. Instead of the teachers coming to us, we went to them. The boys, too, began to participate in Jr. High Athletics; it seemed rather awkward at first but better as time went on. That year we elected class officers to lead the class. Jasper Propst decided he needed a change of scenery so he left us to attend Rosedale.

In 1952, under the guidance of Mr. Sweet and Mr. Boroughf, we found very little change in our activities. Jasper Propst rejoined us again. Just couldn't stay away! Urbana Local sent us Judy Clemens. They had to, she just wouldn't stop talking about Mechanicsburg. Not to be left out is Eddie Hiltibran, who

took his report card from St. Paris and immediately joined us.

1953 was our Freshman year! Mr. Diley and Mrs. Spitzer were our teachers. That was the year we found ourselves wearing "silly costumes" to school. The y called it Initiation!! The boys were eligible for Varsity sports and some joined FFA and others Hi-Y. The girls, not to be left out, joined FHA and Y-Teens. From Triad came Peggy Randall, and Lynne Cushman from Rosedale.

In 1954, we called ourselves Sophomores. This year, with Mrs. McNemar and Mr. Boroughf, we had a pleasant year. Mr. Gant became our Superintendent, bring-

ing his daughter, Mary, from Struthers to join our force.
In 1955 our Junior year was full of important and exciting events. Mrs.
Griswold and Mr. Belville were our leaders. Under their sponsorship we earned money for our activities by working in the shack. This year Nancy Gregg decided to leave Salem to join us. For weeks we heard "Act Your Age", echoed on every Junior's lips. No, we weren't being bossy-just advertising our Class Play. In May we transformed the gymn into a realm of "Outer Space". The prom was truly "out of this world".
