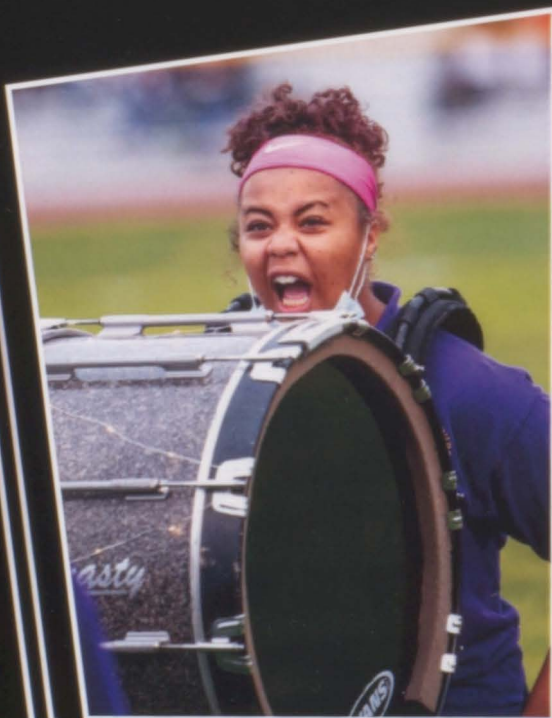
2020 MHS Marching Band

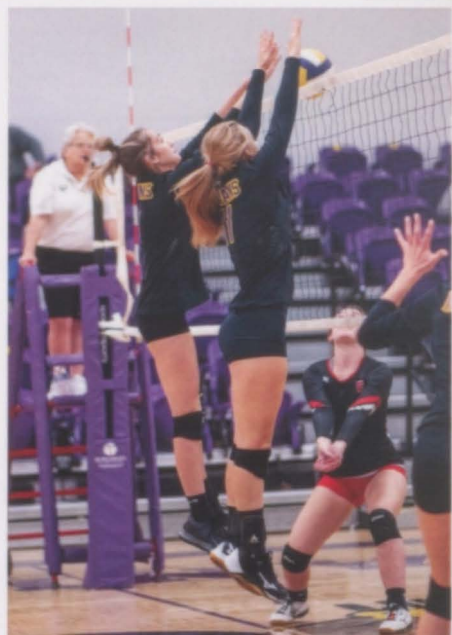

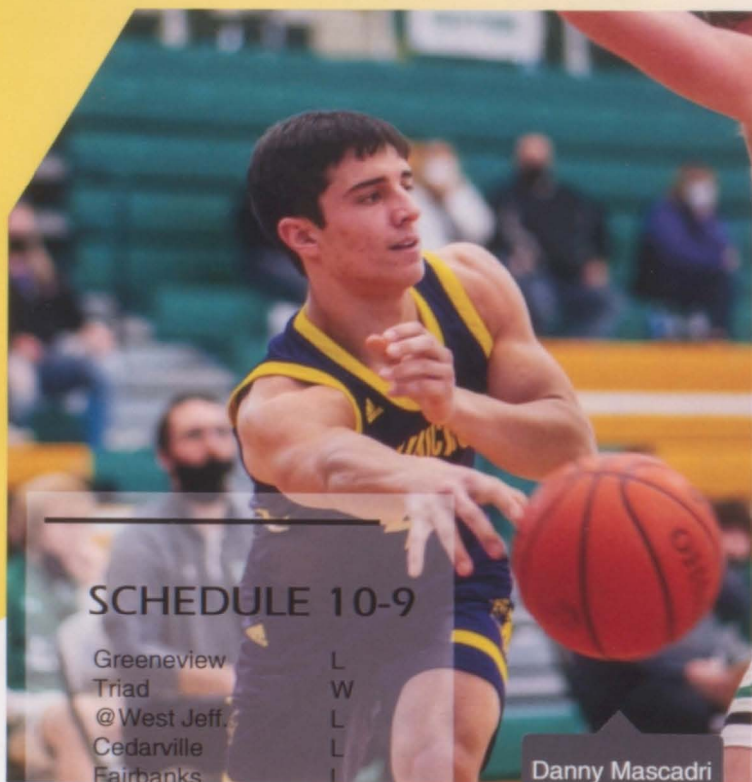
Boys Basketball

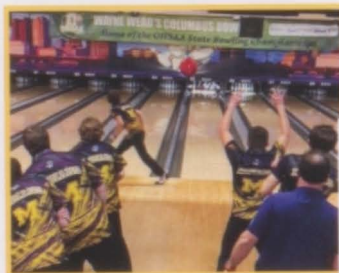

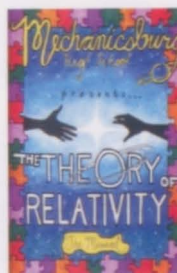

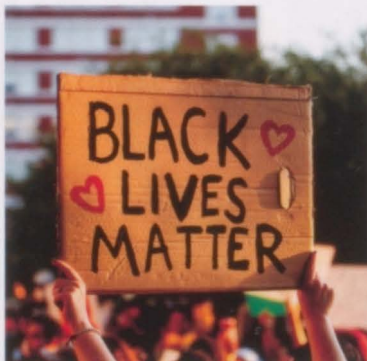

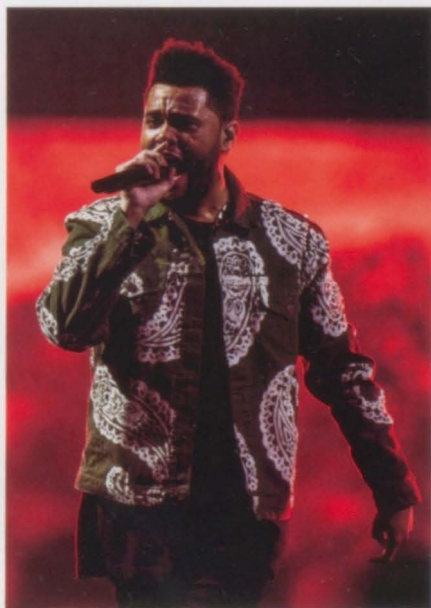

THE NOTORIOUS RBG

The nation mourns Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg's death on Sept. 18 at the age of 87 from complications due to metastatic pancreatic cancer. Over the course of her prolific legal career, Ginsburg argued many landmark cases relating to gender discrimination and was nominated to the Supreme Court in 1993. Known for her dissenting opinions and the collars she wore with her robes – especially her dissent collar – Ginsburg gained pop-culture fame and was often referred to as "RBG." 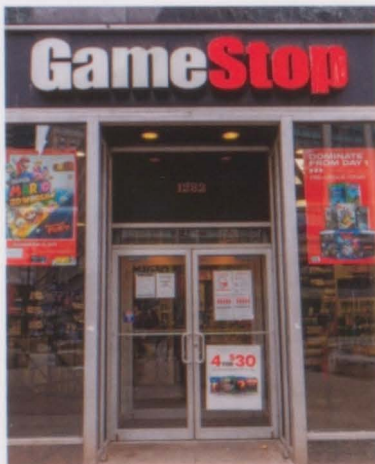

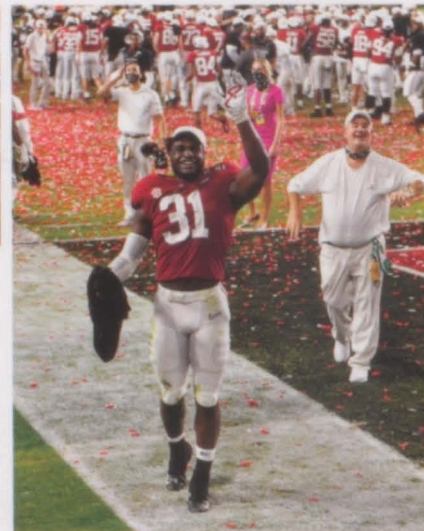


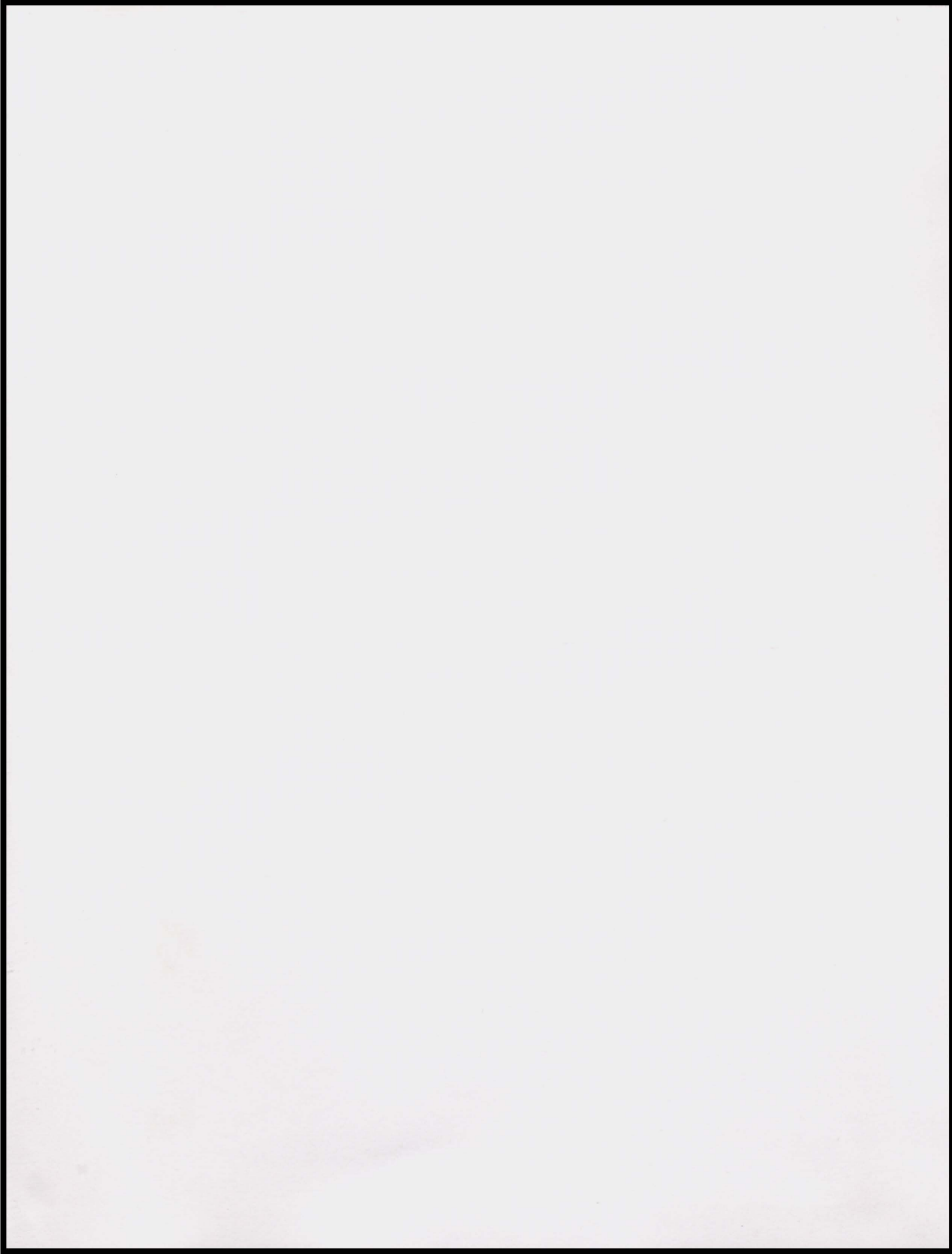
Stop Everything for GameStop.

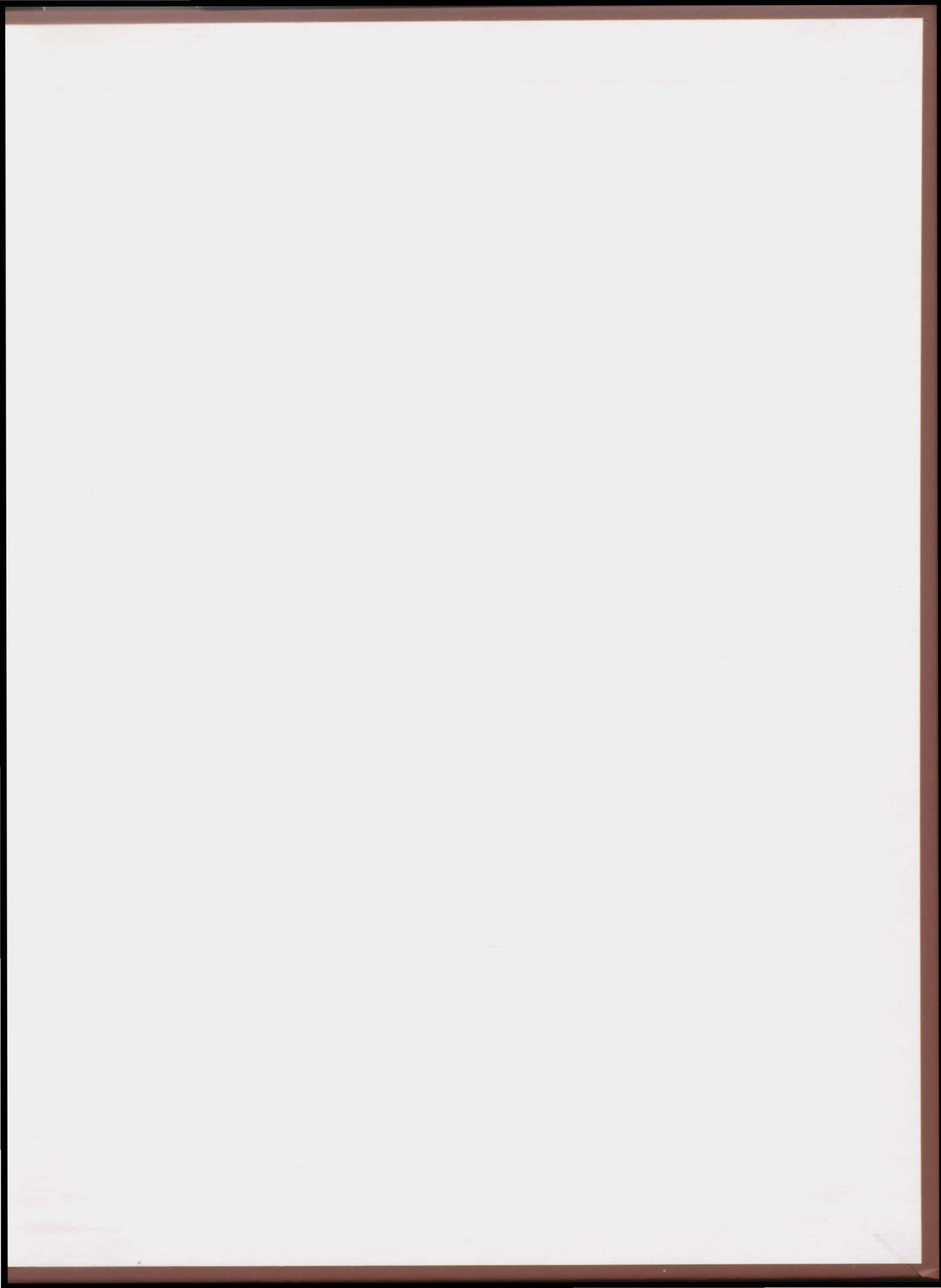

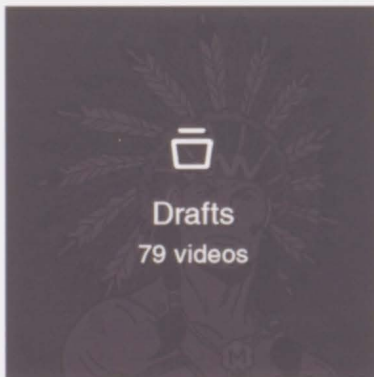
