2. How old are you and when is your birthday? 17 years old, $8 / 22 / 82$
3. What inspired you to become an exchange student and why did you choose the US to come to?
I've always wanted to go to the USA. Not just to learn the language, but more to find out what it is like to live in a host family and in a different culture. What it is like to be without my parents.

I don't really miss my family. We always write or call, so they are here too, but I miss my friends a lot. In the beginning not that much, but now I'm starting to miss them.

In my country it's totally different! At age 16 you can drink. Though nobody cares if you do it before your legal age. When you turn 18, you are "independent". You are an adult. Then you can get your license, go everywhere ... it's really fun!

I have liked it so far, though I thought it would be so much different. But it's okay, my family is great! Rafa and I are going to North Carolina for 3 days with the softball team.
